Expression of Interest (EOI) for Empanelment of drug testing laboratories

1. BACKGROUND

Government of Bihar (GoB) is committed to provide timely and effective Health Care Services to the people of Bihar. A majority of the poor people of Bihar usually depend on Public/Government Health Care Delivery Systems to address their preventive and curative health needs. Optimal availability of good quality drugs procured at competitive prices, quality provision of health related services and proper construction and maintenance of health facilities are of paramount importance for better Health Care Delivery. In such a scenario, the financing and supply of drugs, services, etc. for government health services has become one of the key concerns for GoB.

To meet the above mentioned objectives in professional manner GoB has set up the Bihar Medical Services & Infrastructure Corporation (BMSIC) under the aegis of the Department of Health and Family Welfare (DoHFW). BMSIC is incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956 and is responsible for the procurement of quality drugs, equipments, services and works for the DoHFW.

Prior to the use of the drugs on patients, their quality testing is recommended from an independent Laboratory. The Department wishes to empanel NABL accredited drugs and pharmaceutical testing Laboratories for carrying out the independent testing of the drugs procured from the approved vendors. Methodology of testing is to drawn the drug sample from the warehouses and mixed them and sent to empanelled labs without identity details for QC testing.

2. PURPOSE OF EOI

Call for Expression of Interest from NABL accredited drugs and pharmaceutical testing Laboratories for empanelment with the Department of BMSICL for analysis of Samples of Drugs/Surgical/Sutures procured by the Department.

3. TERMS OF REFERENCE

Terms & Conditions for Empanelment of drug testing laboratories:

- Laboratory should be NABL accredited.
- > The Laboratory should have a minimum of three years experience in analysis of drugs/chemicals and pharmaceuticals items.
- Laboratories should have sufficient in-house infrastructure and calibrated equipments/apparatus to carry out the tests prescribed in the Drugs and Cosmetics Act.
- Laboratory should have technically qualified and well experienced strong in-house resource base.
- Microbiological facilities available in the laboratory.
- > The applicant should furnish an undertaking to the effect that the laboratory has not been black-listed in India.
- Analytical laboratory should furnish the test reports within 15 days from the date of receipt of the samples of Tablets, Capsules, Pessaries, Ointments, Powder and Liquid Oral Preparations and within 30 days from the date of receipt of sterile preparation.

- ➤ The empanelled laboratory should ensure the timely renewal of the NABL accreditation.
- Copy of Essential Drugs List of BMSICL, attached with this document.

4. Eligibility Criteria:

Only analytical Laboratories having licensed under the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940 and with NABL accreditation are eligible to apply.

5. Submission Requirements-

Interested firms shall be submitted the following documents in sealed envelope super scribed as "EOI foe Empanelment of Drugs testing Laboratories".

- 1. Self attested and notarised Photocopy of Analytical Licence duly renewed up to date, issued by the Drug Controller of the state.
- 2. Documents, to show that the Laboratory has been recognized NABL.
- 3. Documentary evidence of having analysed Drugs/Surgical/Sutures for the last three years.
- 4. Self attested documents of the following
 - a) The list of qualified personnel employed in the laboratory.
 - b) The list of sophisticated instruments available in the laboratory.
 - c) Microbiological facilities available in the laboratory.
- 5. Details of List of drugs/surgical/sutures for which testing capability available as given at Annexture-1.
- Documentary evidence for the constitution of the Lab such as Memorandum and Articles of Association with details of the Name, Address, Telephone Number, Fax Number, e-mail Address of the firm and the Managing Director/Proprietor.
- 7. Location map of the Laboratory.
- 8. Firm complete Profile

6. Selection Process

After scrutiny of the documents, the BMSICL will inspect firm and if found fit for the testing of the Drugs/surgical/sutures the selected parties will be called to participate in Limited Tender to finalize the Empanelment of Lab. Selection will be done on the basis of, the capability of undertaking the tests, location of the lab and the time taken for submission of reports.

7. Last Date of Submission of EOI

The EOI may reach the office of the undersigned on or before 3.00PM on 9/1/2012 through Registered post/ Courier/Speed Post in the office of Managing Director, BMSICL, 5th floor, Biscomaun Bhawan, Gandhi Maidan Patna-1, Bihar. EOI received after the said time would be returned unopened.

The EOI will be open on 10/1/2012 **(11 AM)** at 5th floor, Biscomaun Bhawan, Bihar and the decision of the BMSICL shall be final, and no enquiries, or application for review, shall be entertained. The BMSICL reserves the right to cancel or reject any EOI /all EOI without assigning any reason at any point of time.
